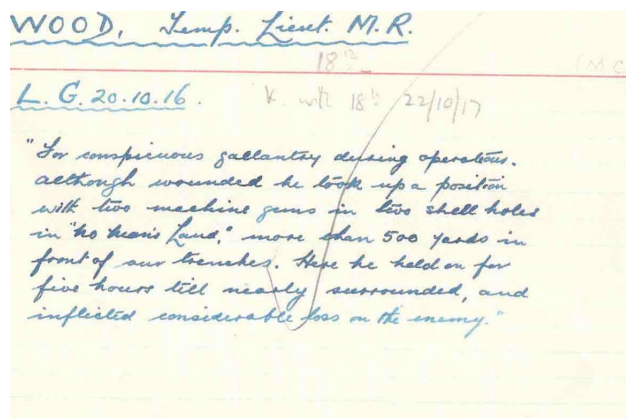
The two large brass candlesticks on the altar in Buckerell church are dedicated to the memory of Captain Matthew Rodney Wood who died in WW1. The following information, researched by Steve Mear, gives us a good idea of how much is owed to men like Captain Wood in defence of our country.

Captain Wood's parents lived at The Manor House in Weston, although the family originated from Durham and according to the 1911 Census, they were living in Newport, Monmouthshire. Matthew Wood served in France with the Lancashire Fusiliers, 18th Battalion, from 29th January 1916 until he was killed on 22nd October 1917 aged twenty-one. The Lancashire Fusiliers were previously known as the 20th Regiment of Foot and were founded in Exeter in 1668 and then known as the East Devonshire Regiment until 1881. Matthew Wood was awarded the Military Cross, the victory medal and the British war medal all of which were applied for by his father in 1922. In 1916 at the Battle of the Somme, Lieutenant M R Wood, though wounded, established two Lewis guns in two shell holes, with the help of Lance Corporal Plant and twelve men. For these actions he was awarded the Military Cross for conspicuous gallantry. The citation for the Military Cross is shown below and reads as follows:

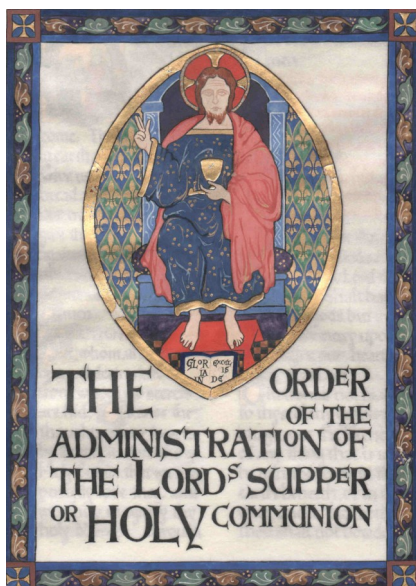


Capt. M. R. Wood, M.C.,

"For conspicuous gallantry during operations, although wounded he took up a position with two machine guns in two shell holes in 'no man's land', more than 500 yards in front of our trenches. Here he held on for five hours till nearly surrounded and inflicted considerable loss on the enemy."



In October 1917 he was involved in the 3rd Battle of Ypres, commanding X Company in the Battle of Cambrai in Houthulst Forest, the company advanced but moved too far away from the adjoining units. Whilst trying to re-establish contact with the other units, the company were outflanked by the Germans and suffered numerous casualties, it was during this time that Captain Wood was killed.

Captain Wood's name is included on the Tyne Cot Memorial which means that no body which could be identified as his, was ever found.

The Tyne Cot Memorial is one of four memorials in Flanders at Zonnebeke that now bears the names of 35,000 officers and men whose graves are not known.

Captain Wood's sister, Ruth Mary Wood presented the church with an illuminated book containing the Communion Service and collects for Christmas, Easter, Ascension Day, Whitsunday and the Feast of the Trinity. She completed the work to the memory of her brother in 1921.

The family's connection with Buckerell Church goes further, Captain Wood's mother, Elizabeth was buried in the churchyard in 1936.

POPPY APPEAL

NEWS FROM THE CHURCH

Our Harvest Festival Service in September was a joint event with the other churches within the Honiton Team and we were pleased to have the church so full. The children told and illustrated the story of The Sower, and a variety of readings and hymns completed a lay-led Songs of Praise. The auction of produce held at Armoury Cottage raised £253.45, the church collection was donated to R.A.B.I., The Royal Agricultural Benevolent Institution. Thanks are due to all those who provided food for the supper and to everyone who helped decorate the church.



On October 4th interviews took place at the rectory in Honiton to find a replacement for the Reverend Allan Sheath. Mrs Jane Lankester has been appointed and will be licensed on February 15th at St. Paul's by Bishop Bob Evens. She will be resident at Awliscombe Vicarage.

On Saturday 15th October a group of people from Buckerell joined others from Awliscombe and Combe Raleigh for the annual Parish Breakfast at The Otter Inn. Lester, Charlie and their staff served a really good breakfast.

A team from Buckerell, competed in the Honiton Team Skittles Competition held at Feniton Bowling Club. We did better than last year coming third.

On Thursday 27th October, a short service was held in the churchyard for the burial of Cynny's ashes in the grave of her husband.

Saturday 29th October saw the annual churchyard clear up - thank you to all those who gave up their time to help.

Our Carol Service is on Wednesday 21st December at 6.30 p.m. and we hope to see as many people as possible. There will be mince pies, tea and coffee afterwards.

Although a new vicar has been appointed, it will be some time before the patterns of service return to normal so please continue to use the Parish Magazine and the two church noticeboards for information. Alternatively phone the churchwardens.

There will be no service at Buckerell on Christmas Day, instead there will be a joint service at Awliscombe at 11.15 a.m. conducted by Bishop Bob.

PARISH COUNCIL

At the meeting held on 3rd November the resignation of David Wayne as both chairman of The Parish Council and as a councillor was announced. It seems likely that a 30mph speed limit will finally be introduced throughout the village by 31st March 2012. The question of flooding on the roads was also discussed and this is now being followed up.

It was agreed that a new noticeboard would be purchased and it is hope to have it in place early in the New Year.

BUCKERELL WEATHER FACTS

The rainfall (with 11 year average in brackets) for September was 66mls (51.8), October 90mls (124) and November 81mls (120). Of the 11 months so far in 2011, three have been wetter and eight drier than the 11 year average. The 11 year average for the 11 months is 892mls so far this year we have had 728mls. 2011 however is unlikely to be the driest year as during the whole of 2003 only 747mls fell. My guess is that by the time you read this at least 28mls will have fallen in December.
