Inner corner cottage (Butts) known as Drullers cottage. Combined here with Taylors shop.

To Yew Tree Cottage (Feniton side). Mr. & Mrs Williams in charge. Bessie Parrs parents. Moved to Butts cottage (next to War Memorial. First public telephone installed.

To the Old Post Office. Mr. & Mrs. J. Clapp. Bucknell without a post office since 1968. Frank Parr also believes Armoury cottage could have been a post office as there was an old wooden posting box, unused in his younger days.

Wheelwright Coganhayes.

Coganhayes being once the name of Hembury Fort Guest House. Mr. & Mrs G. White gave the name to their home.

Nail Shop - Rose Cottage.

Pound. Patch of land between Watery Lane and Orchard. Two cottages opposite (Pound cottages) demolished in 1900.
